This week we will begin Multiplication of fractions. I have uploaded multiple videos to help with the next two weeks on the homework page. This quarter there is an emphasis on FRACTIONS. The EOG is $\frac{1}{2}$ fractions and the children really need to know and understand the processes in adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing as well as reducing fractions and mixed numbers. If we have weather events that take us out of school I will be sending email and video lessons to help keep us up to date. IXL is a great place to work as well. I will be giving specific assignments on fractions, but lessons above and below level are easy to access on IXL to help with remediation or enrichment/acceleration.
